#### **COVID 19**

Since September, Covid has been the number 1 priority in school. As outlined previously, we have implemented many changes to how we do things in school. From POD's to facemasks, social distancing to sanitizing, under the guidance of our LWR's Ms Martin and Mr D Byrne, we have managed to make the best of a bad situation, even if it is a very different experience to this time last year. Covid has also limited greatly the range of activities that we have been in a position to get involved in. #### THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

The school's current Board of Management has just commenced a new three-year term. The Board consists of eight members. Four are Trustee nominees; Mr. Gerry Forde (Chairperson), Mr. Jim Hurley, Mr Dara Lynott and Miss Ann Walsh. Two are teachers' nominees; Ms Linda Scallan and Mr Peter Kirwan. Two are parents' nominees: Mrs Helena Kirwan and Mrs Mary O'Byrne.

I would like to thank outgoing Board Members, Mr. Sean Hurley, Mrs Ann Barry and Mr. Anthony Roche who made a huge contribution to the Board over the last 6 years, at a very important and historic time particularly in overseeing the redevelopment of the school building.

#### THE PARENTS' COUNCIL

The Parents' Council A.G.M. was held in October. The following officers were elected: Caroline Busher (Chairperson), Paula Fenlon (Secretary), Jenny O'Keeffe (Treasurer). The Parents Council have continued to support the work of the school, sponsoring Gaeltacht scholarships and contributing to the school Wellbeing Committee and fundraising efforts in the school. They meet monthly and are always happy to accept new members.

#### STUDENTS' COUNCIL

The Student Council is body of students which aims to represent the whole school community. Each class group at Junior Cycle level has one elected representative on the Council. At Senior Cycle level each year group has four representatives. A new Students' Council has been established for 2020/21. An election was held for each year group. The Council is now successfully up and running. It is a very active group within the school. Meetings are held on a fortnightly basis and any student can bring an issue to the attention of the Council and ask the members to advocate for change if necessary. Issues often raised are the school uniform, the canteen facilities, the fairness of certain school rules etc.

This year is a little different to other years, however, and at the start of the year the Council was involved in a poster campaign to raise awareness about Covid 19 and the new procedures which are in place to protect students in the school at this time.

The Student Council also liaises with ERST and attempts to foster the spirit of Edmund Rice in the school. With this in mind, the Council organized a sponsored fast in aid of the homeless on Friday December 11<sup>th.</sup> So far, a little under €1,800 has been raised thanks to the generosity of students, parents and staff.

It remains to be seen what next year will bring but there is no doubt that the Student Council will remain active and continue to be a voice for all school students.

# SCHOOL PITCH REDEVELOPMENT

Really exciting news in relation to the redevelopment of our school pitch. The final phase of our school redevelopment is the instillation of an all-weather floodlit AstroTurf soccer pitch on our school grounds. This would be the first of its type in the county. The Board of Management hope to submit a planning application for the pitch in early January. The overall cost of the project will be in the region of €400,000 and will need to be financed from our own resources but it would be a really wonderful facility for all our students for training, PE and especially for an area to play at lunch time. The need for space has become even more of a priority during Covid where we really need open areas to circulate in the fresh air during break times.

#### CHRISTMAS SHOEBOX APPEAL

In November, our traditional shoe box appeal took place but under very different circumstances as it had to be a digital shoebox this year. Well done to all students and parents who took part in this year's Christmas Shoebox Appeal. The participation levels were very high and it's great to see our students giving back at this time of the year.

We are currently in the process of setting up a Past Pupils Association. #### IN NOVEMBER WE REMEMBER

We commemorated All Souls' Day and All Saints' Day this November by writing the names of the loved ones we've lost and miss dearly on the leaves of a tree. Sixth years: Roy Somers, Kyle Lewis, David J Kelly and Sean Byrne, helped create the tree and the CBS students coloured and wrote their remembered family and friends' names on the leaves. At the end of the month our chaplain, Fr. James Cullen, led a prayer of remembrance on the intercom of the school for each student and staff member who are grieving the loss of someone this year or remembering a friend or family member. He acknowledged it has been particularly difficult this year because we could not have the traditional remembrance services with all our family and friends around us due to restrictions. We felt it was important to create a sacred space for remembering our loved ones who are no longer with us and we will leave it up into the new year to give us comfort. May they and all who have died from Covid rest in peace.

# **DUBLIN ZOO & SECRET VALLEY**

It has been a difficult year for many this year, our friends in Dublin Zoo and Secret Valley were no exception. Wexford CBS has strong ties with both places and I am sure we all have personal, happy memories there too. # MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

During these trying times we all need a bit of extra support and so the Mental Health First Aid Team was born. Our aim is to help and support our colleagues, we spend so much of our time at work, it makes sense that we know how to look out for and help one another. We have also organised a calendar full of positive, uplifting moments throughout the year. With the continued support of management, we know we will get through this year and be a stronger school community.

#### TRANSITION YEAR

Transition Year students have been busy since September with a combination of exciting activities, workshops and modules. The first excursion was a two-day trip to the IOAC in Tagoat where the boys bravely tackled the high ropes, kayaking, crate stacking and an obstacle course. They also walked 18km along the cliff walk in Rosslare Harbour as part of the Gáisce adventure. In October the boys had a drumming and Segway workshop. In November the boys completed a First Aid course and went mountain biking to Fort Mountain. For the Christmas trip, the students went to Leisuremax. Last Friday the boys sat DAT tests which are good at determining what subjects to choose for Leaving Cert. Even Santa made a visit and provided lunch.

For the remainder of the year the boys have workshops in photography and self- defence to look forward to. Students will be completing a Drivers Ed programme in February and in March, will be going paintballing. In April all TY's will go surfing and finish the year with a trip to Tayto Park.

Transition Year students are offered exciting modules including Media Studies, Careers, Drama, Economics, Woodwork, Consent, Chinese, Computers, Enterprise, American Studies, Road Safety, Public Speaking and many more exciting modules to ensure the students are engaged in independent, self-directed learning. This year GAA Future Leaders is also offered to all TY students. The aim of the Future Leader programme is designed to encourage maturity, initiative, responsibility and leadership skills in students.

Work Experience is an important aspect to the Transition Year Program. Each student has now taken part in one cycle of work experience each Monday for 8 weeks and will repeat this again after Christmas. Work Experience is a valuable opportunity for the students to gain an insight into a working environment. Many use this opportunity to sample careers, which they may be contemplating. This will also help when deciding on what subject options to choose for their Leaving Certificate. Co-operating with strangers, discovering new environments, handling real-life situations, all contribute to the development of the individual and provide valuable material for subsequent curriculum vitae and interviews.

I would like to thank the employers for giving the boys the opportunity to take part in work experience.

The Attitude of Gratitude has been a great success, reflecting on what we are grateful for created new perspective which was particularly important in these challenging times. This was an incredible achievement for the boys who handled a wide variety of topics and were up against excellent competition for so long.

In this years competitions which are also being held via online forums our senior teams in the Leinster schools competitions are having mixed success so far with Ronan Brennan and Darragh Sinnott looking likely to make it to the knockout phase. #### **GREEN SCHOOLS**




# Colaiste Eamonn Ris Career Guidance 2020/2021


